He taught me the job but it was my responsibility to never let him regret it. He was my best friend. I miss his calls the night before saying 'I'm bringing you lunch tomorrow.' I already miss his calls to tell me his latest stories. Even if they made him look bad if it was a good story he was going to tell it and he would laugh every time and no matter how many times he told it - everyone else would too. I miss him. I will always miss him. I was never as good a friend to him as he was to me. I wasn't very close to my own brother - and I always loved how close he was to David. That's how brothers should be. Their whole life. Its how he raised his own kids to be. He loved Kelly and he loved his kids - and he may never have called them without saying their names in all-caps but he was incredibly proud of them.
